## St John's Primary October 2019 Newsletter

In the Hamilton Grammar Learning Community our Primary 1,4 and 7 teachers are meeting regularly to work together to plan and assess writing. This will support teacher judgements and further develop consistency across all 5 feeder schools for Hamilton Grammar. Teachers are visiting each other's schools and observing the teaching of writing lessons and sharing good ideas.

We hosted a very popular and busy Book Fayre during our Open Day in September. We have used the commission from the Book Fayre to purchase novels to further challenge our children and to provide a range of different texts to interest readers.

Our Primary 3 children are enjoying a lunchtime club for dance run by a Hamilton Grammar 6th year pupil. The children have learned some excellent routines and are thoroughly enjoying the chance to work with an older pupil.

Head Teachers in Hamilton attended a safety training briefing to help keep children safe online. From this we are planning to host a training event for parents to support keeping all children safe in the new year.

Our Primary 7 pupils have started their visits to Hamilton Grammar School as part of our transition programme. In October our Primary 7 parents also got the chance to visit the Grammar to meet staff and hear about a day in the life of a first year pupil.

As part of transition to secondary school our senior pupils have started a record of achievements which count towards an award at the end of the year. All schools in our Learning community are working on JASS Awards and our P7 children are aiming for Bronze by the end of the term We plan to take this forward into secondary school where children can then work towards silver and eventually gold. As part of this award scheme our children have decided to regularly visit a local Care Home to meet residents, read to them and talk about their memories. Later on the children plan to invite quests from the Care Home to school for a tea party.

Our Girls and Boys Football teams both participated in local tournaments and football festivals throughout October. They showed great sportsmanship and skill when playing. It is very much appreciated to have our parent helpers who accompanied the teams as we could not attend if it wasn't for their help.

Our Netball team participated in the Hamilton tournament and also acquitted themselves well.

Room 5 and 7 presented a great assembly about safety. They showed us rules to keep ourselves safe and who to talk to if we are worried. All children were wonderful on stage.

Room 2 braved the elements for a local walk to Cadzow Glen. Lots of leaves, cones and twigs were collected and brought back to school to look at, draw and make into pictures. They really needed their wellies as it was dry when they left but exceptionally wet on return.

Our teaching staff are working together on a training programme called Tapestry. This is the second year of this training for our staff. In this teachers work together to observe and reflect on their own and colleagues' work in order to improve the learning for our children. Teachers are very enthusiastic about how the small changes they make in their teaching have made large improvements for learners.

As part of our School Improvement Plan we are looking at the cost of the school day. We are very aware that sending children to school can be a costly occurrence. We have audited what we are currently doing and are looking for parents/ carers who would be able to commit to attending about 3 meetings over the year with children and staff to discuss ways in which we can ensure that all children get the same opportunities and that we reduce pressures on parents regarding school and money. We held a recycling event on Friday 25 October where anyone who wanted came along to the dining room and chose a dressing up costume. Thank you for all of the donated costumes.

We hosted two Halloween Discos on Wednesday 30 October. Both were very well attended with more than 200 children dressing up and dancing the night away. Thank you to all our parent helpers who kindly gave up their evening to come along and make the event a success. Lots of congratulations to the creativity of parents in making and recycling costumes.
