We are looking forward to all children starting and stopping school at 9am and 3pm. There is no requirement for us to have a one way system to enter and leave the playground any longer. All adults need to wear face covering when within school grounds. The car park will only be open to drivers of ASN transport and blue/red badge holders. All drivers are encouraged to use the Bent Park as part of our Park and Stride initiative. In reducing the number of vehicles accessing the school grounds will make it safer for children to be crossing at the main gate.

Transition events are underway with Hamilton Grammar School for our Primary 7 pupils. There have been activities and information posted on the Google Classroom for pupils to access. We are very fortunate to have Mrs Adam, from Universal Connections, come to school each Wednesday. She is working with small groups of Primary 7 children preparing them for moving onto secondary school. We also have children who are attending Give Us A Break groups in Hamilton Grammar as part of our enhanced transition programme. We had an very informative afternoon when Senior Pupils from Hamilton Grammar School visited to talk about their experiences of secondary school.

Pupil Voice is a very important part of life in St John's and our Rights Respecting School Group, our Pupil Council and our Junior Road Safety Officers have joined together to improve things around our school. The key areas which were highlighted by these groups was the amount of litter around our school and the volume and speed of traffic entering the school grounds.

The children have:

- Created posters to remind drivers of the speed limits around our school
- Met with our MSP, Monica Lennon to look at safety around the school
- Organised a competition about designing bright and eye catching attire to be seen when out on bikes/ walking
- Writing to newspapers and Scottish Parliament to advocate for change to improve our school Environment

We are using a new programme in ICT to support children with literacy difficulties. It is called Nessy and children come every day to the ICT suite with Mrs Sharples to develop strategies to help with reading and spelling.

Caroline, our Early Years Worker, is continuing to develop outdoor learning and forest school activities. Children are improving key life skills. We surveyed our P1, P4 and P7 classes in January about their views on outdoor learning and created display with all their opinions. From the survey we are going to offer more training to staff to allow for further opportunities outdoors.
