- Planned a celebration of St John's being reaccredited as a Gold Rights Respecting School.

Caroline, our Early Years Worker, is continuing to develop outdoor learning and forest school activities. Children are improving key life skills. This term the children are focusing on identifying different types of trees and how to tie a variety of knots.

Room 9 were very excited to welcome a delivery of trout eggs after their visit to Glasgow Science Centre. They are monitoring the eggs each day and are expectantly waiting for them to hatch.

We are pleased to let you know that we have started a new support programme which targets P1 literacy acquisition- NELI This programme focuses on developing:

- Active listening
- Extending vocabulary
- Narrative skills

Children work as individuals and in a small group of up to 6 with a trained teacher. We are looking forward to seeing the results.
